

## Fourth of July Pinwheel Wall Hanging

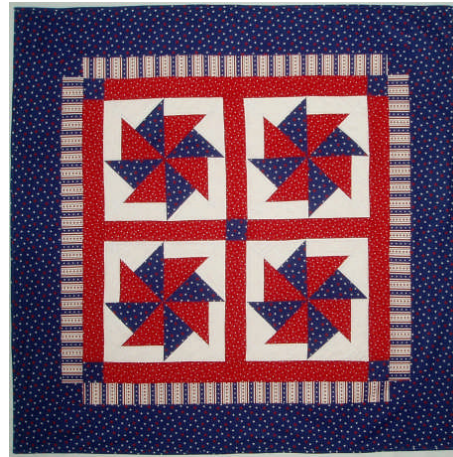
**Project Level:** Advanced Beginner

### Materials:

- $\frac{3}{8}$  yard white fabric
- $\frac{2}{3}$  yard red star fabric
- $1\frac{1}{4}$  yard blue star fabric
- $\frac{1}{3}$  yard striped fabric

### Suggested OLFA Tools:

- 6 x 24 "The Essential" Acrylic Ruler
- 6 x 12 "The Traveler" Acrylic Ruler
- 45mm Quick-Change Rotary Cutter
- 24 x 36 Self-Healing Rotary Mat



Completed project approximately 41½" square

### Pre-construction:

*Cut the white fabric as follows:*

- One strip 4 $\frac{7}{8}$ " wide, sub-cut into eight 4 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares
- One strip 6 $\frac{3}{4}$ " wide, sub-cut into sixteen 6 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 2 $\frac{1}{8}$ " rectangles

*Cut the red star fabric as follows:*

- One strip 4 $\frac{7}{8}$ " wide, sub-cut into eight 4 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares
- Two strips 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " wide, sub-cut into four 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles, which will make the sashing between the four large blocks
- Four strips 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " wide, sub-cut into four 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 24 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles, which will make the first border

*Cut the blue star fabric as follows:*

- One strip 4 $\frac{7}{8}$ " wide, sub-cut into eight 4 $\frac{7}{8}$ " squares
- One strip 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " wide, sub-cut into nine 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares, which will make the center square and cornerstones in the first and second borders
- Four strips 5" wide, sub-cut into two 5" x 32 $\frac{1}{2}$ ", making the third border sides
- Sub-cut into two 5" x 41 $\frac{1}{2}$ ", making the third border top and bottom

*Cut the striped fabric as follows:*

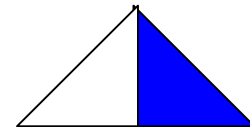
- Four strips 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " wide, sub-cut into four 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 28 $\frac{1}{2}$ ", which become the second border

### Construction:

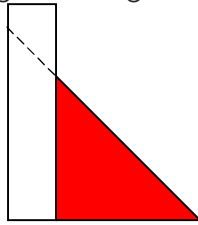
*Use a ¼" seam allowance*

To create the four large pinwheel squares:

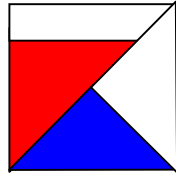
1. Take one white 4 $\frac{7}{8}$ " square and one blue 4 $\frac{7}{8}$ " square, layer right-sides together
2. Cut diagonally
3. Repeat seven more times
4. Sew one side of the 16 triangle sets together (see diagram)
5. Iron seam to the blue fabric
6. Cut the eight red squares diagonally. Sew a white rectangle 2 $\frac{1}{8}$ " x 6 $\frac{3}{4}$ " to each of the sixteen triangles
7. Iron the seam to the red fabric



- Trim the white fabric at a diagonal using the red triangle as your guide



- Sew a blue set to a red set to create a block
- Repeat 15 more times



- Sew four blocks together to create a pinwheel
- Repeat three more times
- Join two top pinwheels by a red strip  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $11\frac{1}{2}$ "
- Join two bottom pinwheels by a red strip  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $11\frac{1}{2}$ "
- Join two  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $11\frac{1}{2}$ " red star strips with a  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " blue square

To create the first border:

- Sew red star fabric to the two sides  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $24\frac{1}{2}$ "
- Sew two blue  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square cornerstones to the ends of both of the  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $24\frac{1}{2}$ " red strips
- Sew one strip to top and the other to the bottom

To create the second border:

- Sew striped fabric to the two sides  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $28\frac{1}{2}$ "
- Sew two blue  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square cornerstones to the ends of both of the striped fabric pieces  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $28\frac{1}{2}$ "
- Sew one strip to the top and the other to the bottom

To create the third border:

- Sew two blue strips to the sides  $5$ " x  $32\frac{1}{2}$ "
- Sew two blue strips to the top and bottom  $5$ " x  $41\frac{1}{2}$ "
- Quilt and bind
