

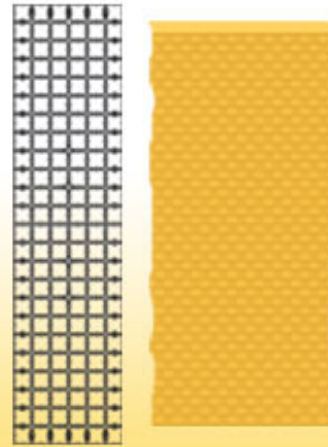
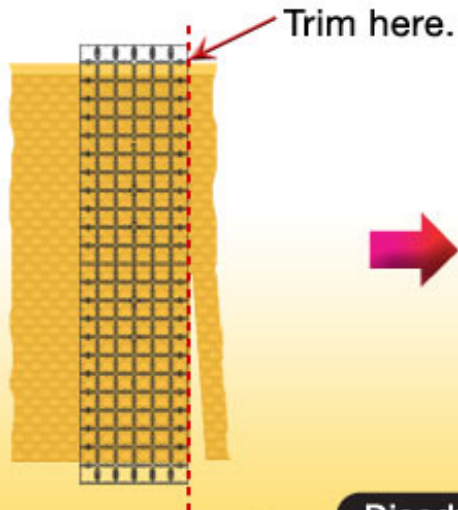
Two Conventional Methods:

Like most things in quilting, there is more than one way to square up the edge and there are advantages and disadvantages to each method.

Conventional Method 1: Use Just One Ruler.



Trim the right edge off.



Advantage:

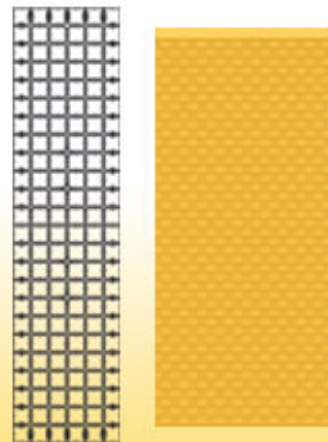
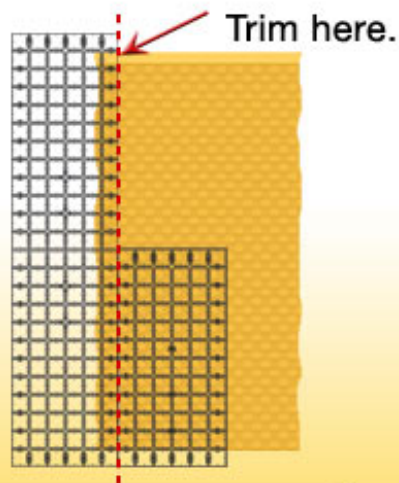
It's easy to control one ruler to accurately align to the fabric.

Disadvantage:

You have to rotate the fabric 180° to start cutting strips because the newly cut edge is on the opposite side.

Conventional Method 2: Use Two Rulers.

Remove the second ruler and trim the left edge off.



Disadvantage:

It's unwieldy to keep two rulers aligned with each other while lining them up to the fabric's edge.

Advantage:

You can start cutting strips from the same side.

(Sides are reversed for left handers.)

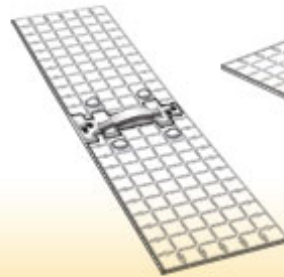

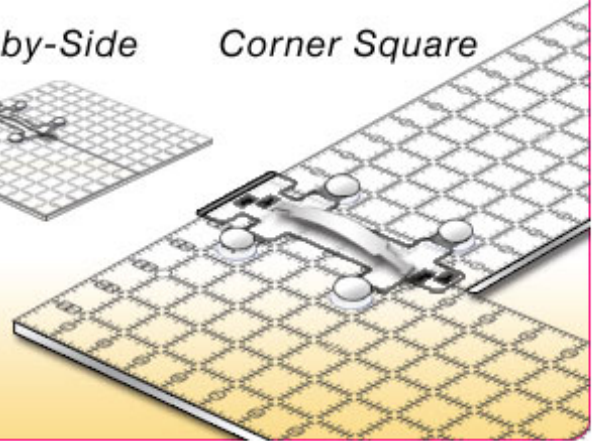

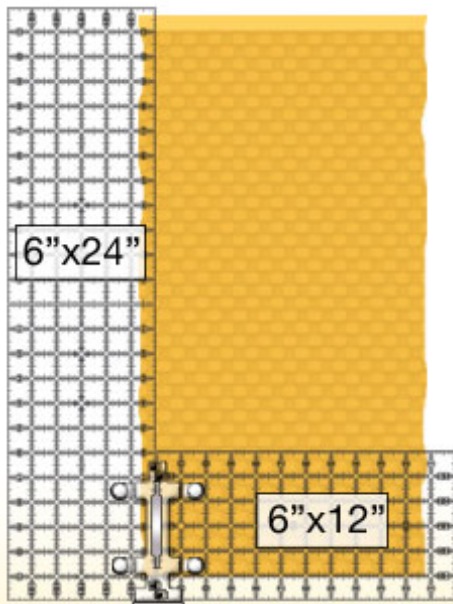


Corner Square



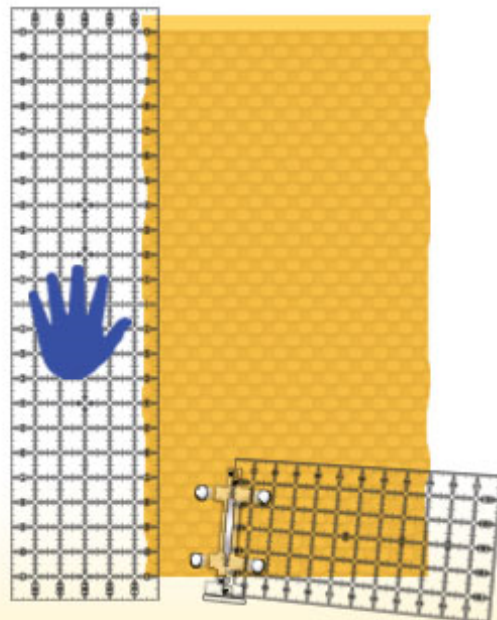
Connect your 12" ruler to your 24" ruler as a corner square.

Advantage 1: It's as easy as lining up using just one ruler.



Advantage 2: You'll have a longer line to line up to the folded edge for greater accuracy.

Remove the 12" Ruler and Connector.



Advantage 3: You can start cutting strips from the same side of the fabric.

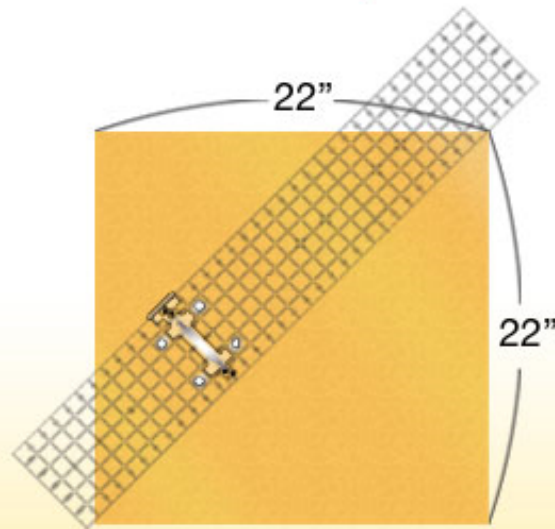
Other Ways to Use the Quilt Ruler Connector:

You can also make a 3-foot ruler to cut bias binding strips.

Connect your 12" and 24" Rulers to Make a 3-Foot Ruler and Cut Bias Binding Strips:

Sometimes a 3-Foot Ruler is Just What You Need,

But who wants to pay for another ruler, especially one that long? Besides, carrying or storing a 3-foot-ruler would be a major hassle.

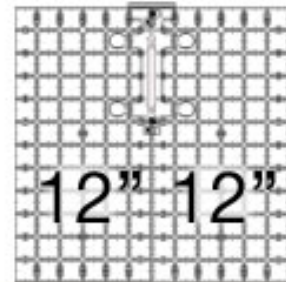
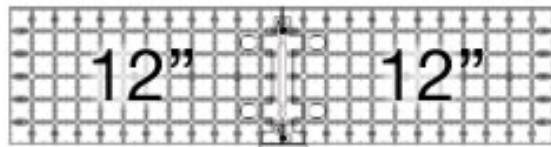
